## **ELECTION INFORMATION FOR DALLAS COUNTY**

### **In-person Early Voting Dates & Times – Dallas County**

April 24 – April 29 (Mon - Sat)	8:00am - 5:00pm
April 30 (Sunday)	1:00pm - 6:00pm
May 1 - 2 (Mon - Tues)	7:00am - 7:00pm

**In-person Early Voting – Dallas County:** Vote at any polling location in Dallas County. The only early voting polling location in the City of Richardson is at the Richardson Civic Center.

**Election Day- Dallas County:** May 6 (Sat.) 7am – 7pm  
Voting on Election Day is at your local precinct polling place for both Dallas County.

**ELECTION INFORMATION FOR COLLIN COUNTY**

**Program**

<b>In-person Early Voting Dates &amp; Times – Collin County</b>	
April 24 – April 26 ( <i>Mon - Wed</i> )	8:00am - 5:00pm
April 27 ( <i>Thursday</i> )	8:00am – 7:00pm
April 28 – April 29 ( <i>Fri - Sat</i> )	8:00am – 5:00pm
April 30 ( <i>Sunday</i> )	Closed
May 1 - 2 ( <i>Mon - Tues</i> )	7:00am - 7:00pm

Collin County residents of Richardson may vote for all 7 places on Richardson City Council as well as Collin County races, which are:

- Plano ISD Board,
- Collin County Community College District (CCCCD) Board, and
- CCCC Bond Election

**In-person Early Voting – Collin County:** The only location where Collin County residents of Richardson can vote early for both the Richardson City Council and for Collin County races is the Renner-Frankford Library. Otherwise, Collin County residents of Richardson must vote early at two locations:

- any Dallas County Early Voting Location (for Richardson City Council) **AND**
- any Collin County Early Voting Location (for Collin County races).

**Election Day- Collin County:** May 6 (Sat.) 7am – 7pm

On Election Day, Collin County residents of Richardson may vote for PISD Board, CCCC Board, and the CCCC Bond Election (but not Richardson City Council) at any Election Day Vote Center in Collin County.

Most Collin County residents of Richardson who wish to vote in one location for both Collin County races AND all 7 places on Richardson City Council, must do so at their local polling place:

- Residents of Precincts 48 and 55 at Aldridge Elementary School.
- Residents of Precincts 94 and 125 at Miller Elementary School.
- Residents of Precincts 78 and 110 at the Police Substation at 2003 Renner Road. To vote for Collin County races, residents of precincts 78 and 110 will also need to vote at any Collin County Election Day Vote Center.

**Format of the Question and Answer Period:**

- ❖ Candidates will be seated in ballot order.
- ❖ Questions will be submitted from the audience on index cards supplied by the forum organizers.
  - ♦ Questions will be asked of all candidates. Do not address your question to an individual candidate.
  - ♦ One question per index card. Please write legibly.
  - ♦ Tellers will collect the index cards containing questions and give them to the screeners.
  - ♦ Questions will be screened for duplication and appropriateness, following League of Women Voters guidelines.
  - ♦ Candidates will rotate answering first.
  - ♦ Candidates in a contested race will be given 1½ minutes to answer each question. Candidates will be given 2 minutes for a closing statement.
- ❖ Timekeeping
  - ♦ The timekeeper will indicate to the candidates when 30 seconds remain, when 10 seconds remain, and when time has expired.
