Everyone in the City of Richardson votes for all 7 places on the Richardson City Council, regardless of where they live.

In-person Early Voting

Early Voting for the May 4 election begins on April 22nd and ends on April 30th. Any registered voter may vote early in person. The Richardson Civic Center (411 W. Arapaho Rd.) is an Early Voting location for both Dallas and Collin Counties.

Dallas County residents of Richardson

Dallas County residents of Richardson may vote early at any Early Voting location in Dallas County.

Collin County residents of Richardson

Collin County residents of Richardson who wish to vote their entire ballot in one location during Early Voting may do so at the Richardson Civic Center. If they do not vote early at the Civic Center, they will need to vote early in two different locations:

- Any Dallas County Early Voting location for the Richardson Mayoral and City Council races; and
- Any Collin County Early Voting location for all other races.

Election Day Voting

Dallas County residents of Richardson

On Election Day, Dallas County residents must vote at their local precinct polling place. A list of Dallas County Election Day polling places is available on the Dallas County Elections Department website.

The Richardson Civic Center is not a polling place on Election Day.

Collin County residents of Richardson

On Election Day, Collin County residents of Richardson who wish to vote their entire ballot in one location may vote at any Collin County Election Day Vote Center in the City of Richardson. These are located at:

- Aldridge Elementary School, 720 Pleasant Valley Lane
- Church of the Nazarene, 2101 E Renner Road
- Miller Elementary School, 5651 Coventry Drive

All voters who live in the Dallas County portion of Richardson will vote on the:

- Dallas County Community College District bond proposal

Format of the Question and Answer Period:

- Questions will be submitted from the audience on index cards supplied by the forum organizers.
 - ♦ Questions will be asked of all candidates. Do not address your question to an individual candidate.
 - ♦ One question per index card. Please write legibly.
 - ♦ Tellers will collect the index cards containing questions and give them to the screeners.
 - ♦ Questions will be screened for duplication and appropriateness, following League of Women Voters guidelines.
 - ♦ Candidates will rotate answering first. Candidates have not seen any questions prior to the forum.
 - ♦ Candidates in a contested race will be given 1½ minutes to answer each question. All candidates will be given 1 ½ minutes for a closing statement.
- Timekeeping
 - ♦ The timekeeper will indicate to the candidates when 30 seconds remain, when 10 seconds remain, and when time has expired.
